RUSSELL GALLERY JURYING PROCESS
Effective January 1, 2012

The Russell Gallery is premier exhibit area at the Plymouth Center for the Arts, located in the original Russell Library building. Plymouth Guild members who wish to show their work in the Russell Gallery must submit a portfolio of work for review by jury. Acceptance will be based on originality, technique, workmanship, and quality of presentation.

- Artists are invited to submit a portfolio of 5 pieces of recent work (within 3 years) for consideration. All 5 pieces must be created in the same medium.
- Artists may become juried in more than one medium, but each medium requires a separate submission of 5 pieces of work.
- The work must be gallery ready and be a cohesive display of artwork in one medium.
- All work must be original. Work created under the supervision of an instructor is not eligible.
- There is no charge for the jurying process.
- Jurying is held two times each year, typically in early January and again in late June or early July (depending upon show schedules, which vary each year). Dates are announced a month or more in advance.
- Jurors are experienced artist members of the Plymouth Guild.
- The jurying process establishes the person as a Russell Gallery artist who is immediately eligible to submit up to 2 pieces of work into the Russell Gallery show. The artwork submitted for future shows must be of the same or higher quality; if not the artwork (not the artist) may not be accepted.
- If not juried into the Russell, the artist will be provided with a brief written statement explaining the reason. The artist may request a more detailed explanation if he/she wants additional information.
